## fMRI Language-Mapping Profile v2.0 Profile

- Dr. Liu has performed a comparison of the current fMRI Profile to the Process Committee streamlined template
- No content from the current version of the fMRI Language-Mapping program was removed; information was simply reordered:
  - Section 1: The Executive Summary was condensed, Section 2 Clinical Context and Claims was shortened, and they were merged into this single section
  - Section 2: Conformance contains standard language re: how to conform to the Profile, e.g., participating staff and equipment ("Actors") shall meet each checklist requirement assigned to them in Section 3
  - Section 3: Checklists were moved to the front of the document so that end users will be able to locate requirements more easily
    - Consensus is needed re: actors and their responsibilities
    - Not all checklists in the template will apply to all BCs
    - Suggestion to consider alignment with CPT codes, where applicable
    - Physicists and physicians to be separated
  - Section 4: Assessment Procedures remains in the same place
  - Appendices: Discussions, subsections, interpretation text and imaging protocol specifications, i.e., details not required for achieving the Profile Claim, were relocated from the body of the document to the appendices
- The main priority will be to establish checklists with appropriate actors for each task; discussion re: the extent of items to include
  - For Profile usability and a greater chance of implementation, the QIBA Process Committee recommends that checklists include only requirements necessary for achieving Claims, with unrequired items located in the appendix
  - A contrasting view was that unrequired items should remain in the checklist, solely for the purpose of standardization
  - Lessons learned from feasibility site feedback on fMRI Motor-mapping Profile checklist items should be considered when developing Language-Mapping Profile checklists; respondents had indicated for each task:
    - When they did not have the capability to complete a task and why, e.g., access to specific software
    - When they had the capability to complete a task and were willing do so
    - When they had the capability to complete a task but would not be willing to perform it in their routine work and why, e.g., time limitations
- To ensure version control, collaboration on a single working Google Doc was recommended
