Discussion:

1.1 Approach

- Imaging Biomarker Qualification Process (IBQP) approach presented by Andrew Buckler on 28 Jan 2010 T-con reviewed.
- Proposed alternate, potentially faster, approach of proceeding with de facto current path, e.g. based on pointing out that RECIST is already used, and vCT and PERCIST are obvious extensions (although FDA may not accept the RECIST extension idea).
- Above alternate method will be in parallel with development of IBQP, and will facilitate development specific use-case of IBQP since there will be a ready source of needed data for the 'Review Process' phase of the IBQP.
- Proposed terminology is going from 1D (RECIST) or 2D (WHO) to 3D (vCT) and 4D (PERCIST), so for both vCT and FDG PET/CT (or PERCIST). There is less ambiguity in the measurements and thus improved accuracy and precision. Not completely accurate, but very likely a useful bullet point to engage FDA with.
- The two-prong approach may also be useful for QIBA vCT group, possibly QIBA as a whole until IBQP becomes established.
- Want to emphasize cooperative working relation with pharma and manufacturers.

1.2 Talks

1.3 Briefing document

- Very important, as FDA plans to use meeting as a basis for proposed guidelines in 2011 or 2012

- Need to add section on Profiles
